## Good News from Pastor Heidi

“After three days they found [Jesus] in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions.” ~Luke 2:46

This is from one of the few stories we have where Jesus is young. He has gone to Jerusalem with his family to celebrate the Passover- a very important festival for Jews. Luke tells us that Jesus’ family always goes to the big city for this holy time. But this year, Jesus doesn’t want to leave. His family doesn’t realize he isn’t in the big crowd they are travelling with and they don’t find him until 3 days later. He was in the temple, in church, the whole time, learning and asking questions. And he amazed everyone there with how much he already understood and knew.

Jesus was a great teacher. When Mary Magdelene saw him in the garden after his resurrection, she calls him “Rabbouni” which means “Teacher.” Jesus taught big crowds of thousands, and he taught his smaller group of disciples and followers. Jesus taught on mountains and by lakes, and he taught in tem-

ples and homes.

Even more important that who and where Jesus taught is what he taught. He taught us to love God with all our heart, soul and mind, and to love our neighbors as ourselves. He taught us the importance of sharing his message with others. He taught us to follow him and listen to his voice above any other voice. He taught us that he is God’s son, and that he is the way, the truth and the life.

As we begin another “educational year” at Grace, I pray that we will all be good disciples, good students of Jesus. There is always more to learn, whether we are 8 or 80. There are many people who need to be taught Jesus message- in our congregation and in our community. This year, make sure you take time to learn more about Jesus- through prayer, devotions, Sunday School, bible studies, worship... there are many ways to learn. May God bless our year of learning and give us new insights into his amazing grace and love!

## Caring for Creation

What wonders of creation did you enjoy this week?

While enjoying the coolness of a goodly flowing river in the north country, mom and dad loon came drifting by, escorting their fluffy, half-grown chick downriver. Too big now to ride on mama's back, where chicks usually spend their early days on the water, the young loon drifted, and "washed" (dipping it's head and wings under water and letting the water run down it's back and sides). It totally enjoyed itself while mom and dad kept watch for unsavory intruders. And speaking of loons, a friend was visiting a northern lake this past week and reported that on this one lake, they saw eight families of loons. Amazing in itself, if not some kind of record, but then, these "wilderness" birds swam and dove right next to their boat. At one point, two were so close that my friends could see small blue-gills in the loons bills. (The loons, it turns out, were more successful fishing than my friends.) Some of the early-of-the-year-dropped fawns are already losing their spots. It won't be long and they will be difficult to tell apart from their older kin. Only size, or antlers, will be your clue. Two hen turkeys with nine pullets have been seen on a regular basis along highway C. These chicks are not very big for this time of the year. They must be a second hatch. The song bird nests are generally empty. The young are flying, but many are still asking to be fed. On the feeder the other day, a young cardinal was being a pest, almost screaming for food. It really didn't need to do that. It was almost as big as mom and was perfectly capable of getting its own sunflower seeds. Kids! They are all pretty much the same no matter what the species. These few instances and observations remind us that the world right now is full of critters. Of course, as you drive you also must have observed that the sides of the roads contain a lot more wildlife - both alive and dead. Drive cautiously. And speaking of young wildlife, a young raccoon found its way into a member's garage the other day/night without being noticed. After the doors were closed for the night, and during the process of trying to get out, it made a real mess - pushing stuff off the shelves - even dropping tools hanging from the walls. The member had to crawl under his truck in order clear a path before he could drive out of the garage the next morning. The little masked bandit ended up spending the night, then the following day in the garage. It could, then would, not leave. (They are nocturnal and don't, generally, move during the day.) The good news comes in two parts: First, on the second night, the critter found the service door which the members left open and it decided the outdoors was better than the stuffy, hot garage. And second, while the owner searched every nook and corner of the garage the next day, to make sure the little "dear" had left and not died in some corner or behind one of the cabinets, he, the owner, cleaned out his garage. His truck load supplied an organization and several individuals with things they could use, plus he got enough \$\$ to buy himself lunch. Now, that's turning a negative into "a good thing."

Towards the end of June, when we briefly discussed the merits, or not, of God's reasons for creating mosquitoes, we briefly mentioned dragonflies as one of their (the mosquitoes) predators. This week a member emailed that she has noticed the abundance of dragonflies and how much she enjoys watching them dip and dive and dart around, chasing and devouring those dastardly, little, blood-sucking mosquitoes. I am sure you all have seen them (the dragonflies), they are pretty hard to miss this year, but have you noticed how many different varieties there are? And, by the way, do you know how to tell the difference between a dragonfly and one of its cousins, the damselfly? (I'll get to that later.) Depending on the source, it is reported that there are some 5,000 species of dragonflies in the world. Four hundred and fifty of those live in North America, and, approximately, 80 species live right here in Wisconsin. (No, I can not tell you how many varieties live in your backyard. You'll have to record them on your own. Sorry. I think I will make that your homework. Yes, report back to me how many varieties of dragonflies you have in your backyard.) Anyway, that, the numbers above, is a lot of mosquito eaters. Think of the blood loss we'd have without them. I can also tell you, that when Riveredge Nature Center took their annual dragonfly count the first week in August, they found 11 different kinds along the Milwaukee River, the ponds, and the prairies. The largest and most common of these lovely creatures is the green darter. I saw one the other day that was over three inches long. A photographer was hoping to get some close-up shots of it. Good luck to her. Oh, you want to know how to tell the difference between a dragonfly and a damselfly: Damselflies are, generally, the skinny ones. But, the surest way to distinguish between them is when they are not flying. When they sit, resting, the damselfly folds its wings over its body. This is opposed to the dragonfly which keeps its wings spread out - looking a lot like a small airplane ready to take off. It is important to note also that both damselflies and dragonflies, in their nymph stage, begin their life as predators. While spending this stage underwater, they eat, among other critters, mosquito larva. All in all, I think God made a very good choice when creating these summertime "friends." One more item that may interest you. They don't bite humans. I have them sit on me all the time when fishing from our boat or canoe or just sitting on our deck. (They show a preference for my bare knees.) They don't even tickle when they land or leave.
